Philippians 2:5-11

*5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. 9 Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, 10 so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.*

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### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

We are going to study Hebrews 2:9 in-depth. For easy reference, sections of this verse are labelled “a” through “e”.

Hebrews 2:9

- a) But
  - b) we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus,
  - c) crowned with glory and honor
  - d) because of the suffering of death,
  - e) so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.”
1. When you think of and imagine Jesus, where is He? For example, is He on the cross? Do you think of Him in His human form walking the earth? Describe the mental picture you have of Jesus. How is Jesus pictured in verse 9?
  2. The first word in verse 9 is BUT, connecting verse nine to the previous verse(s). How does verse nine logically flow from and connect to the previous verse(s)?
  3. What action or event impacts Jesus in 9b that is also referenced in verse 7? Who is behind this action?
  4. What is the significance of Jesus being crowned with glory and honour (9c)? (Research: What do crowns represent? Who can bestow crowns? How does this crown compare with the crown of thorns placed upon Him in Matthew 27:29, Mark 15:17, and John 19:2, 5?)
  5. Why is Jesus crowned with glory and honour (9d)? What does that mean?
  6. For what purpose is Jesus crowned with glory and honour (9e)? To whom does this apply?
  7. Why is it important that Jesus taste death? How do we benefit from his “tasting death” for us?

Application:

What sorts of crowns (good works) do you try to place on yourself? What might it look like to toss aside your efforts and celebrate that Jesus tasted death for you?

What thinking pattern or default habit do you need to correct to focus your thankfulness on the finished work of Christ properly? How will you accomplish this?
