SERIES: The Book of Revelation: Worthy is the Lamb

PASSAGE: Revelation 16:1-21

BIG IDEA: 5 Realities of the Wrath of God

DISCUSSION:

1. The wrath of God is DEVASTATING (Read Rev 16:1-21)

- a) When you read of how devastating the wrath of God poured out will be, what sort of response does it stir in you?
- b) What assurances does the believer have regarding God's wrath (see 1 Thessalonians 5:9)?
- c) Are you destined for God's wrath, or can you claim the assurances of 1 Thessalonians 5:9? How do you know?

2. The wrath of God is DESERVED (16:1-7)

- a) Why was the wrath of God deserved (v6)?
- b) Who deserves the wrath of God (Romans 2:1-11)?
- c) What is the standard by which all sin is measured and judged?
- d) Will there ever be a time when God's wrath is not a concern?

3. The wrath of God is DELIBERATE (16:8-16)

- a) Despite the wrath being poured out, how did the people respond (v9-11)?
- b) What do you learn about God and His heart toward the wicked in 2 Peter 3:9 and Ezekiel 33:11?
- c) How does the above truth transfer to and impact your life?

4. The wrath of God is DECISIVE (16:17-21)

a) Compare what the voice that came out of the temple shouted (v17) with what Jesus declares from the cross in John 19:30. How do both statements connect to God's wrath? What did it mean for the people in Revelation and what does it mean for people today?

5. The wrath of God has been SATISFIED (16:17, 18, 19; John 19:30)

- a) What does it mean that the wrath of God has been satisfied?
- b) How does knowing the wrath of God has been satisfied provide believers with peace as we read about the trials coming to earth?

PRAYER POINTS (based on Revelation 16:1-21):

THE PRAISEWORTHY QUALITIES OF GOD THE FATHER AND GOD THE SON:

- God remains in control even in his wrath (v1, 17)
- God is just, holy, eternal, righteous, and true (v5-7)
- God has full power over the plagues of judgment (v9)
- God is the Almighty (v14)
- Jesus is coming again soon! (v15)
